Julie Hardin serves as the Executive Director of InConcert Sierra (ICS), a dynamic Nevada County nonprofit organization dedicated to presenting classical music. ICS presents renowned and emerging classical musicians to the community and produces concerts featuring its all-volunteer, high-level community choir, the Sierra Master Chorale, as well as the professional regional InConcert Sierra Orchestra. Since joining ICS in 1997, Julie has navigated the organization through significant changes and economic challenges, including the pandemic. Under her leadership and guidance, ICS boasts a world-class concert season that includes an exciting new collaboration with the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center, extensive and dynamic educational programs for all ages, a strong financial reserve, and a stellar reputation for excellence. Julie is currently spearheading a multi-million dollar capital campaign to build an elegant acoustic concert hall and event complex, ensuring sustainability for ICS and other local arts organizations and local nonprofits.

Previous to InConcert Sierra, Julie owned and operated Bouzy Rouge, a popular Nevada City restaurant known for its singing servers. It was there she met her husband, Ken Hardin, ICS's Artistic Director, solidifying her commitment to the musical arts. Julie moved to Nevada County with a varied background, including formal education and experience in corporate customer service, restaurant and business management, marketing, and public relations. Deeply passionate about her community, she has served on several boards and committees, including the Center for Nonprofit Leadership, KVMR's Classics DeClassified radio show (as a founding member), the Nevada County Arts Council, and the Nevada City School of the Arts Foundation. Currently, Julie serves on the board of trustees for Hospice of the Foothills and sings with the Sierra Master Chorale.
